WHAT: The Los Angeles Fire Department Leadership Academy is an intensive, graduate college-level course that provides practical leadership tools for today's fire service leader. It was developed by the United States Military Academy at West Point and adapted to the needs of the LAFD.

WHEN: The class meets for one orientation day followed by four, four-day blocks, and a graduation day according to the following schedule:

COLLEGE CREDIT:

REQUIREMENTS:

The LAFD Leadership Academy is offered on an off-duty basis and students must secure the necessary time off. Student should possess college-level academic ability, a commitment to complete substantial reading assignments, written assignments, computer exercises between sessions, essay examinations and a final term paper at the end of the course. Applicants must be the rank of Captain I or above or civilian equivalent with approval through their chain of command.
