## FIRE COMMAND 1C



**Fire Command 1C “I - Zone Firefighting for Company Officers, Wildland Interface”**, one of eleven courses required by the California State Fire Marshal (CSFM) to achieve CSFM certification as a “Fire Officer”, is a 40-hour course that provides information regarding strategies, tactics, and scene management principles associated with emergency incidents involving the wildland/urban interface. Course content incorporates Incident Command Systems, wildland fire behavior, fuels, weather, topography, Incident Action Plans (IAP), strike team responsibilities, I – Zone communications, “Size-Up” considerations, firefighting resources/capabilities, safety, survival, evacuation, structure triage, structure protection, and I – Zone simulations.

This course accommodates platoon-duty schedules; therefore, students need only attend one date under each session. Students will receive 2 lower division college units accredited by the California State University System. Class begins at 0800 hours in Room #205 at the Frank Hotchkin Memorial Training Academy, 1700 Stadium Way, Los Angeles, Ca., 90012, (213) 485-8984. Reservations not required.
