You are the Captain assigned to Engine 109. Temperatures have been in the high 90's for a week. Relative humidity is 15%. Today is the second day of a Santa Ana wind event. Wind speed is approximately 20-25 mph. At approximately 1300 hours, Task Force 88, Engine 83, Engine 109, Engine 99, Battalion 10, Battalion 14 and two helicopters are dispatched to a brush fire in the

Sepulveda pass. E109 arrives on scene first. The fire is located in medium brush on the west side of the freeway south of Mulholland. The fire is approximately 1/2 acre in size and is rapidly moving uphill. Your Engineer spots the apparatus in a safe “anchor” location. Your crew initiates an 1 1/2” hoseline and begins to attack the hot flank of the fire.

You recognize that the hot flank of the fire is threatening a residential community.

Captain Guidelines

- Establish Progressive Hoselay SOG's with your crew.
- What equipment will your crew carry?
- Establish a water supply.
- Place the remainder of the first alarm assignment.
