You are a Captain assigned to Fire Station 51. It is approximately 1700 hours on a New Year's Day. The majority of your first-in district consists of Los Angeles International Airport. You have responded to several incidents at different terminals today. The terminals are extremely crowded with holiday traffic and passengers. Security is very tight. Security inside the airport is handled by a government agency. They are primarily responsible for passenger check-in. This includes checking

packages and operating sophisticated radiological equipment. Engine 51 and RA 51 are dispatched to “chest pain” at the Bradley Terminal. When you arrive inside the terminal, you observe two of the government security officers talking to a very agitated man. They wave you to come over to your patient. The man is wearing a large coat and is waving his arms wildly. You approach the two security officers and the agitated man to see if you can be of assistance. As you get to within 10' of the

Incident, a glass bottle drops out of the man's coat and breaks on the ground. Simultaneously, a loud audible alarm emits from a radiological monitor carried by one of the security officers. Both of your FF's and FFPM's are with you.
