



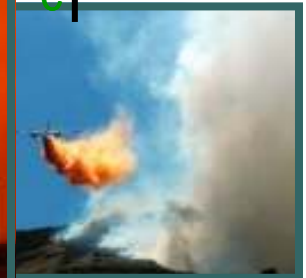
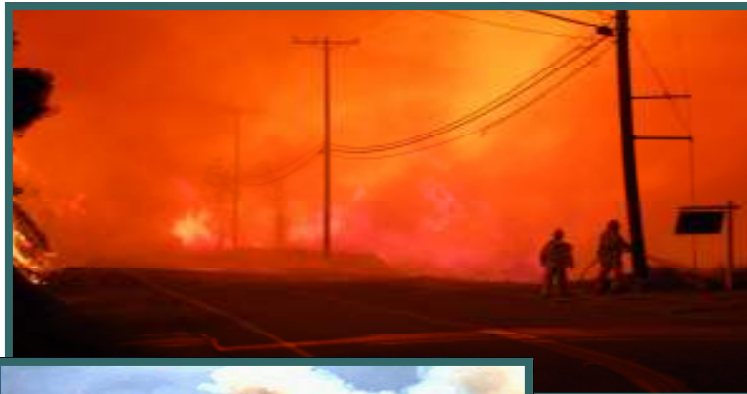

It is mid-August. You are the Captain I assigned to Engine 58. Temperatures are in the high 90's and this is the second day of a strong Santa Ana condition. A brush fire broke out last night near the junction of the 101 freeway and the Malibu Canyon exit in Calabasas. At approximately 0900 hours Los Angeles County Fire Department requests the assistance of a Strike Team for structure protection. Engine 58 is dispatched to Fire Station 88 in order

to form up Strike Team 1001 with four other engine companies and a Battalion Chief. Strike Team 1001 receives a briefing from the BC and leaves immediately for Malibu Canyon. Once onscene, Strike Team 1001 is given a structure protection assignment. Engine 58 is directed to protect 2 houses. The houses are large, but have good brush clearance. You establish LCES with all of your crew. You observe another house approximately 200 yards away.

The house is being protected by LA County Fire Engine #8. They are in an excellent location to be your “Lookout”.

### Captain Guidelines

- Can you communicate with LACFD E8 via radio/How?
- Do you have a page in the Wildland Operational Guide for this area?
- Are you allowed to use a company from another agency as an established “Lookout”?
- Describe Safe Zone- and apparatus preparations for immediate “burnover”.
