- Solutions from the field will be printed in next months “Tactical Decision Games” publication.

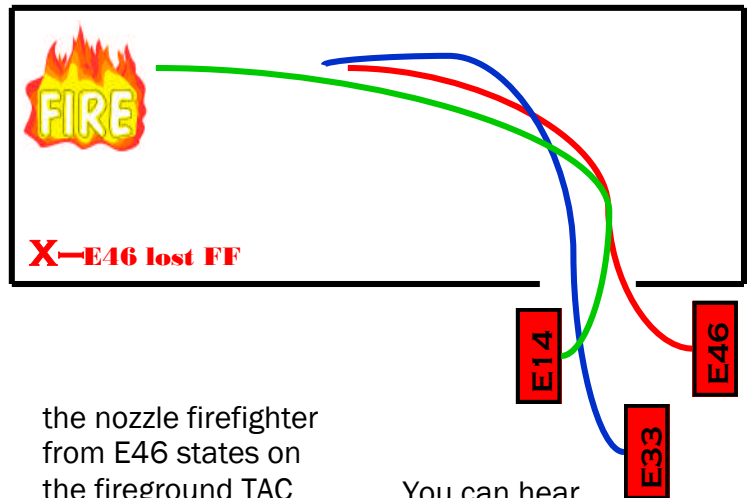

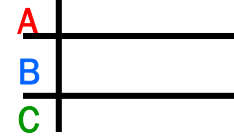
RIC TEAM

Situation

You are the Captain assigned to E33. Your Task Force has been dispatched to a structure fire in progress with numerous companies already operating onscene. While enroute you hear the IC state that it is a 300' x 200' commercial building with heavy fire in the rear. When you arrive onscene, the IC assigns your Task Force Rapid Intervention. You deploy on the “A” side of the building with E14 and E46 operating inside. Both companies entered the structure with 1 3/4” hoselines through the “A” side entrance. You elect to utilize a 1” hoseline for search and rescue. Your RIC team consists of yourself and the two firefighters from E33. Shortly after setting your team up with all appropriate equipment,



the nozzle firefighter from E46 states on the fireground TAC channel, “Emergency Traffic”. In clear text, this member states that he has been separated from his company somewhere in the rear of the occupancy. Your RIC team quickly follows E46’s 1 3/4” hoseline inside. You pass two members of E46 who are on their way out. They have no information for you. You reach the end of E46’s hoseline without successfully locating the lost firefighter. Somewhere in the distance you hear a PASS device in the alarm mode.



Use Training Code 08AD for Network Staffing Entries

You can hear the lost firefighter talking on the TAC channel and you can hear his PASS device over the same radio channel. You estimate that this lost firefighter is approximately 100’ from your location. Your team starts to go toward the sound of the PASS device, but you have run out of 1” hoseline.

Captain Guidelines

- Develop Search/Sweep Tactics from end of 1” hoseline
- Describe radio communications to Rapid Intervention Group Supervisor
