# LOST!

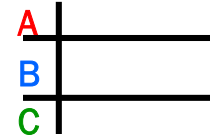
## Situation

You are the Top Firefighter assigned to Truck 58. Your Task Force is part of a “B” assignment dispatched to reported structure fire. E71 is also responding from quarters and will be the first arriving company onscene. Your Task Force will be “second in”. The location of the incident is north of Sunset Boulevard in the hills. It is 1800 hours.

E71 arrives onscene and states to OCD that they have a large two story single family dwelling with fire showing in one room on the second floor. Your Task Force has just crossed Sunset Blvd. and is responding uphill. Your Truck encounters heavy civilian traffic and the AO slows the Truck to a crawl.



The AO finally breaks out of traffic and you arrive onscene. You encounter a 300’ long driveway. Truck 58 is assigned ventilation by E71. You and your company carry the appropriate equipment and ladders up the long driveway. During this ascent you hear E71 state that the fire has extended into the attic. You finally arrive at the house and you observe a newer “Mission Style” house with a Spanish tile roof. The appropriate amount of ladders are placed and you are the first member to arrive on the roof. You see smoke coming out of the Spanish tiles

and are able to confirm that the fire is in the attic. The roof tiles are only held in place by one nail and you can remove them easily. As you proceed up the roof removing tiles, it gives way and you fall thru the attic space and land in a bathroom. Your leg is injured and you cannot walk. Smoke conditions are medium to heavy with no fire.
